In addition to these issues, I have a number of other guest editors working on issues: one on Jewish lesbians, one on Asian lesbians, an issue thinking about knowledge transfers, and an issue on disability and disAbled lesbians. I'm excited about all of these issues - and people always suggest NEW issue on different themes (this past week someone suggested an issue on Lesbian Widows and I still want to publish an issue focused on sci fi and fantasy writing). So there are always lots of ideas percolating up that lesbians want to read about and work on! One of the joys of the journal.

In November, I'm focusing on our fundraising campaign to make sure we have enough money to carry out our plans for 2020 and beyond. Thank you for your monthly support to help make Sinister Wisdom happen. It is such a thrill to see the journal grow and thrive.

Sinister Wisdom 115: Lesbian Learning is already off to the printer and it will be coming in to the office in early December (I hope!) In the middle of November, there is an amazing event launching the Beth Brant book at the San Francisco Public Library. I will be traveling for that event (and out of the office for a week!) and am looking forward to getting that issue into more people's hands.

Three amazing books to recommend to you this month. I read Carmen Maria Machado's wonderful new book IN THE DREAM HOUSE. It is a memoir with a difficult topic: emotional abuse in a lesbian relationship. In spite of the challenge of the material, it is beautifully written and an important book, particularly how Machado nods to the predecessors of her work in lesbian-feminist culture. Jeannette Winterson's new book FRANKISSSTEIN is a wonderful romp through literary history engaging Mary Shelley and others from her circle and telling a contemporary story about artificial intelligence. It is worth the read. Finally Carolina de Robertis's CANTORAS is an amazing story about a group of lesbian friends in Uruguay during the 1970s and 1980s. I recommend it.
